Forum Coordinator Report

Our Oregon Area should pat ourselves on the back-you have stepped up with an increase in Forum subscriptions, and have rallied to send in countless sharings. I am so proud of my Al-Anon Oregonian's!! But our work isn't done yet; here is an update from Tom Coffey at WSO:

- Increase in subscribers: Ever since the World Service Office stopped sending complimentary copies of The Forum to groups, there has been an increase in subscriptions. This has been most notably from groups buying subscriptions. Please remind groups that receiving The Forum is a great way to make the magazine visible, and let everyone know of its value for recovery.
- The Forum needs more sharings! We are very short on sharings about the three Legacies--especially about Steps Five through Twelve, and all Twelve Traditions and Concepts of Service. Also needed are sharings from Canada and from Alateen members.
- New Department in The Forum: In October, The Forum began a yearlong series of articles written by members of the Board of Trustees. They share about the recovery their service provides them, and provide an inside peek at the work the Board does for our fellowship.
- THE FORUM BOOK (working title): So far, members have sent in over 270 titles and publication dates of Forum articles they consider the best of recent years. Please encourage members to let the WSO know which Forum stories they want to see included in this book. And don't forget to send in your own picks too!
- Instant Step Meetings: Beginning in January, the "Instant Meeting" feature of The Forum will include, in addition to two or three brief sharings on the Step of the month, several thought-provoking questions to get the conversations started.

Archives Coordinator Report

Since my last report I have been working on continuing to organize and verify the documents archived. Of the documents stored in paper format, I am currently in the process of verifying that electronic copies have been stored and beginning to dispose of paper copies of the older AWSC and Assembly minutes. This process will minimize the amount of fireproof storage needed. Once all old minutes have been destroyed by shredding, a determination will be made regarding how many more file cabinets are needed

Thank you to members who suggested searching online sale sites for used fireproof cabinets. In all likelihood, the used cabinets to be purchased will be 2-drawer systems to make them easier to move when the archives files storage area changes again. (4drawer cabinets weigh several hundred pounds each and are difficult to move.)

I have also begun the process of compiling historical information regarding Al-Anon in Oregon with the plan to publish a history sometime this year. I will be working in conjunction with WSO archives staff to assure the information gathered is as accurate as possible.

Cooperating with the Professional Community Report

The Area Public Outreach Action Committee, Panel 56 (2016-2018), has developed a strategy to reach out to the State of Oregon. In 2016 we focused on the public, and public media. In 2017 the committee will focus our efforts on reaching out to the professional community: Police, courts, counselors, fire and EMT, Hospitals, anyone who might deal with the family of a person with a drinking problem. In 2018 the committee will focus on outreach to Institutions: Treatment psychiatric agencies, hospitals, hospitals, correctional facilities.

In 2016, the Public Outreach Action Committee facilitated a Grant process whereby any Al-Anon partnership of groups, District, Group, partnership of Districts could apply for a financial grant from Oregon Area to help fund a new or continuing Public Outreach project. Oregon Area set aside \$4,000 for these projects. Which meant that if all 17 Districts in the state asked for funding, each District would receive \$235 for their project. Well, disappointment? Let Go and Let God! Only two Districts submitted proposals. District 6 (Lane County) and District 10 (East of Portland). They will be sharing at the March Assembly about their Outreach projects.

But, Good News! The Grant process has been continued for 2017. Your Group, partnership of groups, District, or partnership of Districts can apply for financial support for your project in 2017. The forms are available from your District Representative. Or, contact the Public Information Coordinator, or Cooperating with the Professional Community (CPC), via the Area Website. Let's reach out to those who still suffer

2017 is off to a fast start. The Public Outreach Action Committee will be meeting again at the March Assembly. Do you have ideas? Come join the committee.



Facing Issues of God and Religion

There are many members who find the spiritual essence of the program perfectly compatible with their own religious beliefs. There are even members who had a deep religious background or a negative religious experience who find that their faith has been enhanced or restored as the result of practicing the Al-Anon program. Yet for most people, the subject of spirituality is very emotional. It stirs up issues such as being forced to go to church, memories of a punishing God, and guilt over interpreting their personal religious tenets to mean that one had to stay in an abusive marriage. As a result *they want nothing to do with God*.

Members report many different ways to deal with their "God issues" in order to digest the true spiritual nature of the Al-Anon program. One popular adaptation for those who are uncomfortable with any mention of "God" is to think of it as an acronym for "Good Orderly Direction." Often the "power" for newcomers are the members in the group, the acceptance and gentleness they feel when they come to meetings or even the slogans (easy does it, keep it simple, one day at a time, etc.)

Yes, God is mentioned many places in Al-Anon literature and the Steps. But, when curious people have an open mind and are willing to study the literature, more than not, they will find "God," "Him," "Higher Power," "a Power greater than ourselves" is **of our** understanding as stated in Step Three.

A newcomer's willingness is the first step. That is the first choice....the crack in the door.... the hope for recovery. The more abstract concepts such as spirituality will come naturally and gently through an outreached hand; a touching sharing or the sense of belonging to something that will make a person feel better for no particular reason....it seems. Developing the internal trust, self-esteem, and the external willingness to reach out for help and become vulnerable to a thing called faith and hope is a major step for many members, one that takes time.

In Al-Anon's daily reader, *Courage to Change*, June 17th "Today's Reminder" the quote from Ralph Waldo Emerson explains the mystery and the magic of the Twelve Steps and of the Al-Anon program that usually happens when members enter the meeting room:

There is guidance for each of us, and by lowly listening, we shall hear the right word. Certainly there is a right for you that needs no choice on your part. Place yourself in the middle of the stream of power and wisdom which flows into your life. Then, without effort, you are impelled to truth and to perfect contentment."

"The word, spirituality means so much it is hard to define... I think that spirituality is living a life that has a deeper meaning than the search for daily necessities. If we live spiritually in our daily life, then we find deeper fulfillment for ourselves... Every activity can have a spiritual motive."


The Spiritual Mystery Surrounding Twelve Step Recovery

It is easy to see why Al-Anon is mistakenly referred to as a "religious program." Al-Anon is based on the Twelve Steps, adopted from Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) and the Steps include the word "God" four times directly and three times indirectly ("His," "Him, and a "Power" greater than ourselves.)

The key to truly understanding that Al-Anon's message is spiritual and not religious can be found in Steps Two and Three (see list on reverse side). Believing in the *God of our understanding* or a *Power greater than ourselves* is the action of members caring for one another in meetings and in the fellowship. It is a spirit of kindness, tolerance, and acceptance. Members may not always do it perfectly, but it is the Al-Anon philosophy and at the heart of Al-Anon's value system.

The benefit of claiming a "Power greater than yourself," is to eliminate the isolation and ego that drives a person who has been directly or indirectly effected by the disease of alcoholism to "stay stuck" in their own shell. The spirit of Step Two suggests that to heal is to come out from within and believe in others or something else that may open doors for new ideas and information.

The Twelve Steps begins with the word "We" and that in itself opens the door for human interaction. For example, most members sponsor other members. For some that's the first step out of isolation. Sponsorship can include taking a member without a car to meetings; answering phone calls in the middle of the night; acting as a guide to understanding the principles of the program or simply being an accepting and nurturing friend. In other words, Al-Anon members give each other hope and love.


