#### **District 9 Report**

To date we have 13 meetings that are active in District 9. Bill W. District 9's treasurer, and I have made a concerted effort to go to all of the meetings every 3 to 4 months. And we have done pretty well at accomplishing this, although this last time through we met up with some bumps. Out of the first three meetings that we visited, two were not where we thought they were. Turned out, one had moved to a new location and one had decided that week to move from Tuesday night to Sunday afternoon. Neither has a GR and didn't think of contacting the district. Kate, our Area's Group Records Coordinator, and Regis, our Website Coordinator, did a great job fixing the schedules on both the WSO and the Area sites. District 9 will be putting on the October AWSC on October 14, 2017. It will be at the same location as the February AWSC, the Tualatin United Methodist church.

District 9 is participating with District 10, 11 and 17 in the Public Outreach Tri-Met bus ad campaign. We have had a good response from all of the groups and have raised over \$600.

#### **District 10 DR Report**

For the March Assembly in Astoria a group of GRs rented a house at the bay. What a fun time this was! We hope there is another chance in our term to rent a house as a group again.

The District 10 business meetings have continued to be well-attended. We have been a little busy and the budget was placed on the back burner for months. The budget was finally approved in May and in that budget there were four half scholarships donated to OAC for their 60th anniversary. There was also some money set aside as small scholarships if a group doesn't have the funds to fully pay for sending a GR to Assembly. This is not intended to cover all their expenses but to assist. For instance, a new group, a male GR, ... this is a trial and there may be adjustments or it may be eliminated in the future. Nearly all GR's reported attendance at their meetings have been on the rise.

The newcomers' meeting in District 10 has traditionally had different groups throughout the District sign-up to chair a meeting. The rotating GR for the Westside newcomers meeting sent around a sign-up sheet at a district meeting and GR's were hollering out what meeting their group wanted. This was incredible to watch the groups work together to assure the meeting is chaired and the rotation of leadership continues.

In a joint district bus campaign, we are in the final stages of preparing to launch the completed project. Thank you to all our individual members who have donated, to all the groups who have participated, to our local AIS office and to the Oregon Area Assembly members. Each of you have participated in making this a reality. What we know as of today is WSO approved our artwork and that the signs are in the process of being made. Until we have a final total on the money collected and if any grants were approved we cannot be sure how many signs or for how long they will be displayed. For now, there will be at least 37 signs, 27 English, 5 Spanish, and 5 Alateen signs "Does somebody drinking bother you" displayed on the

back of buses that run routes from Forest Grove to Gresham and from North Portland to Wilsonville through the month of August. Once the signs are complete and paid for, if the buses are not in use, then our signs will go up early at no charge. The same will be at the tail end, if no one has purchased the space then our signs will stay up. This has been an amazing use of our links of service.

District 10 continues to supply local food banks with pamphlets. We hope to place more pamphlets in School Based Health Clinics this year.







#### **District 11 report**

Hi everyone, I'm excited to be the new District Representative for District 11! I stepped into the District Representative service position 9 months ago, September 2017.

There are currently 8 Group Representatives and 12 active meetings in District 11. Several groups also have an active Alternate Group Representative who attends district meetings and assemblies, as needed, to help keep their group connected when the GR is not available.

This year, our annual Chili Cook-off fundraiser will be held in autumn instead of spring; we hope to have flyers available at the July assembly.

In January we surveyed members about the Prayer for Today, using information from the 2016 World Service Conference Summary. Many members commented that they appreciated being asked to share their thoughts.

We also surveyed members to see what project they would most like to be a part of at the district level in 2017. From the results, we are working to start a 12 legacies meeting and to host a 'meet the district' event before one district meeting this year.

A couple of representatives are exploring Alateen and have a school in mind to develop a relationship with. We are looking for District 11 members interested in becoming an Al-Anon Member Involved in Alateen Service (AMIAS) to actively be an Alateen sponsor.

Groups in District 11 have been overwhelmingly supportive of the TriMet public outreach campaign. Many groups took extra collections specifically for the project and some even chose to host an event. Two such events were a dessert social and a garage sale held to raise funds for the project.

Our district meetings are held on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday of each month from 6:30pm-7:30pm. We have restructured our district meeting format slightly to

allow time for everyone to share their present concerns at the beginning of the meeting and a reflection of their experience at the end of the meeting.

We are also using a system of sharing in rounds some of the time to make space for everyone to speak and be heard. We would love to see you there!

I think of When District 6 (Lane County/Eugene/Springfield), I think of the hundreds of people I have sat in meetings with over the years. The tears and the laughter, the support and guidance and friendships that will last a lifetime. I think of the love and passion of the people who have come together to lift each other out of the depths of despair and grief. We come together to battle the deadly disease of alcoholism. With gratitude for the gifts of the program we freely share these gifts with those who are ready. We also share the many ways we experience the love of our Higher Power. District 6 is about people recovering together through the literature and living life to the full through the 3 legacies of steps, traditions and concepts.



#### DISTRICT 17 REPORT

District 17 includes part of Clackamas County east of the Willamette River and includes Milwaukie, the town of Willamette and town of West Linn. Currently, we have 20 meetings, which includes 2 Alateen meetings and 1 Spanish-speaking meeting. We have a very active Alateen sponsor, Cathy C., who has followed up with the schools that requested Alateen literature and the district has paid for books to be distributed to schools that request them.

A couple of the schools would like to have Alateen meetings on site and we need to have more sponsors for that to happen. Also, insurance is being requested for the Alateen meetings, which we hope will be available this year.

There are presently 13 group reps and most attend our District Meetings. Our Newcomers' Meeting is before a regular Monday night mtg. Our groups sign up to rotate responsibility to facilitate the meetings with many having speakers to share on various topics, Steps, Traditions and Concepts. We have an AA liaison who attends local AA meetings and distributes our flyers and brings back news about what they are doing. Our liaison is currently meeting with AA's District 15 to put together a joint activity. The District held a couple of writing workshops which were facilitated by the Forum Coordinator, Lainey, in support of WSO's request for writings for the new publications.

The district had its annual Spring Fling fundraiser for the AIS office on April 22<sup>nd</sup> from 10am-12 and was a huge success. We raised approximately \$1300. The theme was on AIS and Speakers from the AIS office shared more about the AIS office as well as their personal stories.

As part of Public Outreach District 17 has joined District 10 and the other districts of Portland to do a bus campaign which starts in August and possibly before. The district donated a large sum from their treasury and the groups contributed separately. This campaign was supported with great enthusiasm by everyone.

Northwest Treatment Centers requested that our district provide Al-Anon speakers to talk at their facilities every 6 weeks. It is a great opportunity for us to carry the message to a group of people who do not know Al-Anon and leave information about the program.

Our district also sponsors a Service Manual book study on the 1<sup>st</sup> Saturday of every month and is informative and well attended by many members from various districts of Al-Anon.



#### **Recovering Through Service**

My first venture into service came about through my ability to read someone's mind! I was sitting across the room from the Group Representative (though I didn't know what that meant at the time). She was making an announcement that the Intergroup employee could use help taking inventory of pamphlets and books. Of course, I knew by the way she was looking at me that she was speaking directly to me. I always aim to please, so I raised my hand and said I'd do that.

I went into the office a few days later to start my "service." As I was counting pamphlets, I stopped to read a lot of them. I was particularly struck with the Alateen pamphlets because they described exactly how I had felt growing up, making me wish I had known about this sooner. Reading those pamphlets led me to become an Alateen sponsor where I was able to learn more about myself interacting with the teens in the group.

Through the years I have held many service positions that all have one thing in common – I received more than I gave! Each act of service provided me an opportunity to know myself better, to learn new skills and to have fun, something I had not allowed myself growing up.

When I think "service" I don't think of what I can or can't do, but how much I want to recover.




