Webster's definition of Ligison: one that establishes and maintains communication for mutual understanding and cooperation
*email: Consider creating a separate e-mail account for your AFG business and invite you home group to become part of an email group. Electronic communication is a great war to get detailed information out so members can focus on it away from the actual meeting. I gives them a channel to ask you for clarification and to share their opinions. Use the suggested email protocol from the Service Manual, page 93: "Use of blind copies protect members' anonymity. Members should select with care the e-mail address(es) they use to conduct Al-Anon/Alateen business. It is recommended not to use members' full names in them. Business e-mail addresses might not provide privacy and could imply affiliation." Offer print copies of any handouts to members who don't have access to email.
